In order to run a smooth tour it helps to be highly organized, and as a leader your ability to develop relationships, flexibility in making on the spot decisions and sense of humor will make your tours more enjoyable for everyone.

HeartCycle has offered several hundred tours through its history, so many existing tour routes are available to select from. More adventurous leaders may create their own routes with the assistance of HeartCycle's mapmakers. New leaders may also call on our many experienced leaders to assist with logistics and planning.

As an all volunteer organization, HeartCycle depends on its members to plan and lead its great line-up of international and domestic cycling tours. If you've ever considered leading a tour for HeartCycle, now may be the time to commit. ANNUAL REPORT TO THE MEMBERSHIP: 2003-2007 FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial statements for HeartCycle's 2007 fiscal year along with 2003-2006 (for comparison) are hereby submitted for the membership to review. The HC board, having re-established sound financial footing in the previous several years, sought to achieve a "break-even" goal in 2007. The positive trend of the several prior years of better than expected ridership on the tours once again manifested itself in 2007 with the result being the club did modestly exceed the goal. It is expected that there will be increased operating expenses in 2008 due, in part, to increases in postage, insurance, and costs and fees associated with the new online registration system. However, given the clubs current financial stability, the board expects to be able to handle these expenses without problem.

Keep up the Training

The riding season is about half over and there is still plenty of touring to do so it is important to keep training. Although the HeartCycle training rides ended in May there are several other opportunities to train with groups in the Denver metro area. Two of those groups are highlighted below.

Team Evergreen

The Team Evergreen Bicycle Club was founded in 1988 and is based in Evergreen, Colorado at the crest of the foothills entering the majestic Rocky Mountains west of Denver.

Team Evergreen promotes cycling and though the love of cycling support the local community with training rides, a monthly newsletter, their Website, and special events both in Evergreen and afar. The Triple Bypass is their flagship event.

Their next training ride is on August 3 and starts at the Evergreen Lake House. The ride will be 31 miles long and cover 3200 vertical feet. The route will cover Evergreen Lake House, Evergreen, Kittredge, Meyers Gulch, Parmalee Gulch, Indian Hills, Highway 285, Tiny Town, North Turkey Creek, High Dr., Stanley Park Rd., Little Cub Creek Rd., Buffalo Park Rd., South Hatch Dr., Snowshoe Rd., Buffalo Park Rd., Evergreen, Evergreen Lake House.

Rocky Mountain Cycling Club

The Rocky Mountain Cycling Club is a premier road bicycling club for Colorado and the Rocky Mountain region, offering a full range of rides for the active, enthusiastic cyclists of intermediate and advanced levels and interests. RMCC has hundreds of members with a wide range of riding abilities. The key to having a pleasurable group-ride experience is to select the type of ride that suits your personal ability and riding goals. If you go out too fast you will likely be dropped and doing the rest of your group riding in a group of one. Go out too slow and you may not feel challenged, and may not be riding with those best suited to you.

There are usually two different length routes for each ride. R/P is the shorter Recreation /Performance route. E is the longer Endurance route. Our rides are selfsupported. While other riders will help you out by loaning you a tube or tool, they will expect you to come prepared - RMCC is not a club for complete novices. Unless you have some group riding experience, please take some time to observe group riding skills from the back of the group. After you are comfortable and gain some skill, you can move forward in the group. You should also be comfortable on a ride of 25-30 miles at 14-16 mph on flat ground.

The next RMCC ride is on August 3 from Aurora to Bennett and return. The R/P route is 43 miles and the E route is 71 miles.
